## STATE OF MAINE.

---

RESOLVE to apportion one hundred and fifty-one representatives among the several counties, cities, towns, plantations and classes in the State of Maine.

---

*Resolved.* That for the seventy-first legislature and the succeeding legislatures, to and including that of the year, nineteen hundred and eleven:

The county of Androscoggin shall choose twelve representatives to be apportioned as follows: Lewiston, four; Auburn, two; Lisbon, one; Poland and Durham, one; East Livermore and Wales, one; Turner and Livermore, one; Mechanic Falls and Minot, one; Webster, Leeds and Greene, one.

The county of Aroostook shall choose thirteen representatives to be apportioned as follows: Caribou, one; Fort Fairfield, one; Presque Isle,

 16 Agatha, 16, range 4-5 and 17, range 4-5,

 32 tion, Molunkus plantation, Macwahoc plantation, 1, range  
 33 5, 2, range 4, 3, ranges 3 and 4, 4, ranges 3 and 4, one; Fort  
 34 Kent, Wallagrass plantation, St. Francis plantation, New  
 35 Canada, Eagle Lake plantation, Winterville plantation, Alla-  
 36 gash plantation, 14, ranges 5, 6, 7 and 8, 15, ranges 5, 6 and  
 37 8, 16, ranges 6 and 8, and all the unorganized townships west  
 38 of range 8, in Aroostook county, one; Ashland, Mapleton,  
 39 Castle Hill, Masardis, Sheridan, Portage Lake, Chapman,  
 40 Waue, Oxbow. Garfield, Nashville, 13, ranges 5, 6, 7, and 8,  
 41 12, ranges 7 and 8, 11, ranges 7, 8 and 4, 10, ranges 3, 4, 6,  
 42 7 and 8, 9, ranges. 3, 4, 5, 7 and 8, one.

The county of Cumberland shall choose twenty-two repre-  
 44 sentatives to be apportioned as follows: Portland, seven;  
 45 Westbrook, two; Brunswick, two; South Portland, one;  
 46 Bridgton, one; Gorham, one; Freeport and Pownal, one;  
 47 Falmouth and Cumberland, one; Windham and Cape Eliza-

48 beth, one; Baldwin, Standish and Sebago, one; New  
49 Gloucester, Gray and Raymond, one; Otisfield, Harrison,  
50 Naples and Casco, one; Harpswell, for the years nineteen  
51 hundred and three, nineteen hundred and seven and nine-  
52 teen hundred and eleven, one; Scarboro, for the years nine-  
53 teen hundred and five and nineteen hundred and nine, one;  
54 North Yarmouth, for the year nineteen hundred and three,  
55 one; Yarmouth for the years nineteen hundred and five,  
56 nineteen hundred and seven, nineteen hundred and nine and  
57 nineteen hundred and eleven, one; Harpswell shall choose  
58 one for the years nineteen hundred and four and nineteen  
59 hundred and eight, if, by amendment to the constitution  
60 annual and regular sessions of the legislature shall be held  
61 in those years. Scarboro shall choose one in the years nine-  
62 teen hundred and six and nineteen hundred and ten, if, for  
63 the same reason, such sessions shall be held in those years.  
64 North Yarmouth shall choose one for the year nineteen hun-  
65 dred and four, if, for the same reason, such session shall be  
66 held in that year. Yarmouth shall choose one in the years  
67 nineteen hundred and six, nineteen hundred and eight and  
68 nineteen hundred and ten, if, for the same reason, such ses-  
69 sions shall be held in those years.

The county of Franklin shall choose four representatives to  
71 be apportioned as follows: Farmington, Chesterville, Tem-  
72 ple, Perkins and Washington, one; Jay, Wilton and  
73 Carthage, one; Phillips, Weld, Salem, Madrid, Avon, Range-  
74 ley, Rangeley plantation, Dallas, Greenvale, Redington and  
75 all territory not included in any other district, one; New  
76 Sharon, Industry, New Vineyard, Freeman, Kingfield,  
77 Eustis, Strong, Lang, Coplin, Lowell, Jerusalem, Crocker  
78 and No. 4, range 3, one.

The county of Hancock shall choose eight representatives  
80 to be apportioned as follows: Ellsworth, one; Eden, one;

81 Mt. Desert, Tremont, Swan Island and Cranberry Island,  
 82 one; Deer Isle, Stonington, Sedgwick, Isle au Haut and  
 83 Eagle Island, one; Bluehill, Surry, Hancock, Lamoine and  
 84 Trenton, one; Bucksport, Penobscot, Dedham, Otis, Maria-  
 85 ville, Amherst and Verona, one; Orland, Brooksville, Castine,  
 86 Brooklin, Long Island and Aurora, one; Franklin, Goulds-  
 87 boro, Sullivan, Sorrento, Winter Harbor, Eastbrook, Wal-  
 88 tham, townships 7, 8, 9, 10, 21 and 33, one.

The county of Kennebec shall choose thirteen representa-  
 90 tives to be apportioned as follows: Augusta, two; Water-  
 91 ville, two; Gardiner, one; Clinton, Winslow and Unity plan-  
 92 tation, one; Windsor, Benton, Albion and China, one; Vas-  
 93 salboro, Pittston and Randolph, one; Chelsea and Litchfield,  
 94 one; Manchester, Hallowell and Farmingdale, one; West  
 95 Gardiner, Monmouth and Winthrop, one; Wayne, Fayette,  
 96 Sidney, Belgrade and Vienna, one; Readfield, Mt. Vernon,  
 97 Rome and Oakland, one.

The county of Knox shall choose seven representatives to  
 99 be apportioned as follows: Rockland, two; Rockport and  
 100 St. George, one; Camden, Appleton and Hope, one; War-  
 101 ren, Union and Washington, one; Vinalhaven, South  
 102 Thomaston, South Haven and Hurricane, one; Thomaston,  
 103 Cushing, Friendship, Matinicus, Mussel Ridge and Crie-  
 104 haven, one.

The county of Lincoln shall choose four representatives to  
 106 be apportioned as follows: Waldoboro, Jefferson and  
 107 Bremen, one; Bristol, Damariscotta, Nobleboro, Edgecomb  
 108 and Monhegan, one; Newcastle, Whitefield, Wiscasset,  
 109 Dresden and Alna, one; Boothbay, Boothbay Harbor,  
 110 Southport, Westport and Somerville, one.

The county of Oxford shall choose seven representatives  
 112 to be apportioned as follows: Rumford, one; Norway,  
 113 Oxford and Hebron, one; Paris, Buckfield and Milton plan-

114 tation, one; Porter, Hiram, Brownfield, Fryeburg and  
 115 Lovell, one; Dixfield, Canton, Hartford, Sumner, Peru and  
 116 Mexico, one; Woodstock, Greenwood, Albany, Stoneham,  
 117 Stowe, Sweden, Waterford and Denmark, one; Bethel,  
 118 Mason, Gilead, Newry, Upton, Grafton, Hanover, Andover,  
 119 Byron, Roxbury, Lincoln plantation, Magalloway planta-  
 120 tion, Batchelder's Grant and all unorganized plantations,

 128 Mattawamkeag and township No. 3, range 1, N. B. P. P.;  
 129 one; Orono and Bradley, one; Lagrange, Edinburg, How-  
 130 land, Maxfield, Enfield, Passadumkeag, Lowell, Burlington,  
 131 Seboeis plantation, Grand Falls plantation, and Summit  
 132 plantation, one; Hampden, Orrington, and Veazie, one;  
 133 Alton, Argyle, Greenbush, Greenfield, Milford, Clifton,  
 134 Eddington and Holden, one; Charleston, Bradford, Corinth,  
 135 Hudson and Kenduskeag, one; Glenburn, Levant, Herman  
 136 and Carmel, one; Newport, Exeter and Corinna, one; Dix-  
 137 mont, Etna, Newburg, Plymouth and Stetson, one; Dexter  
 138 and Garland, one; Patten, Mt. Chase, Millinocket, Stacy-  
 139 ville plantation and all territory not otherwise classed,

The county of Piscataquis shall choose four representatives  
 142 to be apportioned as follows: Dover, Sangerville and Park-  
 143 man, one; Foxcroft, Guilford, Abbot, Sebec, Barnard plan-  
 144 tation and Bowerbank plantation, one; Brownville, Katah-  
 145 din Iron Works, Williamsburg, Atkinson, Orneville, Med-  
 146 ford, Milo, College Townships and Lake View plantation,

147 one; Wellington, Kingsbury plantation, Blanchard, Shirley,  
 148 Monson, Greenville, Squaw Mountain township, Gore A,  
 149 No. 2, Day's Academy grant, No. 6, range 13, Chesuncook  
 150 township, Northeast Carry township, Willimantic, Elliotts-  
 151 ville plantation, Lily Bay township, Kineo and all townships  
 152 not enumerated, one.

The county of Sagadahoc shall choose four representatives  
 154 to be apportioned as follows: Bath, two; Bowdoinham,

 156 mond, Perkins, Woolwich, Arrowsic and Georgetown, one.

The county of Somerset shall choose seven representatives

 176 Belmont, Morrill, Liberty and Palermo, one.

The county of Washington shall choose ten representatives  
 178 to be apportioned as follows: Eastport, one; Calais, one;  
 179 Lubec and Trescott, one; Jonesport, Machiasport and Cut-

180 ler, one; Harrington, Columbia, Columbia Falls and Addi-  
 181 son, one; Cherryfield, Steuben, Milbridge, Deblois and  
 182 Beddington, one; Machias, Jonesboro, Roque Bluffs, Cen-  
 183 terville, Whitneyville, Northfield and Wesley, one; Pem-  
 184 broke, Perry, Charlotte, Meddybemps, Cooper, Alexander  
 185 and Robbinston, one; East Machias, Marshfield, Crawford,  
 186 Marion, Whiting, Dennysville, Edmunds and No. 14 plan-

 198 ton, one; South Berwick and Old Orchard, one; Berwick  
 199 and Wells, one; Kennebunkport and York, one; Kittery  
 200 and Eliot, one.
