### STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND ONE.

AN ACT to repeal section sixty-two of chapter twenty-seven of the Revised Statutes, as amended by section seven of chapter three hundred and sixty-six of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-five, relating to State Constables.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. Section sixty-two of chapter twenty-seven of
- 2 the Revised Statutes as amended by section seven of chapter
- 3 three hundred and sixty-six of the Public Laws of eighteen
- 4 hundred and eighty-five is hereby repealed.
  - Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
