STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND ONE.

An ACT to amend section four of chapter one hundred and thirty-two of the Revised Statutes relating to the criminal jurisdiction of magistrates.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section four of chapter one hundred and thirty-two of the 2 Revised Statutes is hereby amended by inserting after the 3 word "law" in the fourth line thereof the following words, 4 namely: 'and of all attempts to commit offences of which 5 they now have jurisdiction by law,' so that the said section as 6 amended, shall read as follows:

'Sect. 4. They have jurisdiction of assaults and batteries, 8 breaches of the peace, and violations of any statute or by-9 law of a town, when the offence is not of a high and aggra-

10 vated nature, and of offences and misdemeanors, jurisdic-11 tion of which is conferred by law, and of all attempts to 12 commit offences of which they now have jurisdiction by law; 13 and may cause affrayers, rioters, breakers of the peace, and 14 violators of law, to be arrested; and they may try and pun-15 ish by fine not exceeding ten dollars, or by imprisonment not 16 exceeding thirty days, and may require such offenders to find 17 sureties for keeping the peace.' * •
