STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE to provide for the expenses of the Maine Industrial
School for Girls.

Resolved, That the sum of nine thousand five hundred dol-
2 lars be and the same is hereby appropriated for the year
3 nineteen hundred and one, and ten thousand five hundred
4 dollars for the year nineteen hundred and two.

And for the expenses for the trustees of said school the
6 sum of five hundred dollars is hereby appropriated for the
7 year nineteen hundred and one and the same for nineteen
8 hundred and two.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

For the last ten years the annual appropriation for current expenses has been at the rate of \$3,500 for each building. There are now two buildings, with a normal capacity of 56, but having 65 girls in them. There are boarded in private families 13 girls from the several buildings. The trustees hope to have a new building ready for occupation by November next. The sum of \$9,500 is estimated as the amount required to carry the school through the appropriation year nineteen hundred one. With three buildings in 1902, ten thousand five hundred dollars will be required. It is estimated that eight hundred dollars per year will be required for the expenses of the trustees.
