IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND ONE.

AN ACT to secure the preservation of the testimony given in trials for murder.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. That whenever any person is convicted of mur-

- 2 der a copy of the indictment, plea, evidence and charge of the
- 3 presiding justice, certified by the official stenographer, shall
- 4 be filed with the clerk of the court where such trial is held.

Sect. 2. Where the court stenographer is paid an annual

- 2 salary the making and filing of said copy will be without
- 3 extra compensation, otherwise to be paid for by the county
- 4 and this act shall not apply to cases where motion for new
- 5 trial is filed.
