STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of aid for a ferry across the St. John river
and Little Black river in Allegash plantation.

Resolved, That the sum of three hundred dollars be and is
2 hereby appropriated to purchase a cable for a ferry boat
3 across the St. John river, and for a ferry boat across the
4 Little Black river in the Allegash plantation, said sum to be
5 expended under the direction of the county commissioners
6 of Aroostook county.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

There are thirteen families or more, who are obliged to come to Fort Kent to do all their business, and to secure the services of a physician in sickness.

They are a good, thrifty, class of people, the larger part of them having lived there from childhood, have endured great hardships in consequence of not having the proper means of crossing these two rivers.

We think that they are justly entitled to some aid from the state.
