STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND ONE.

AN ACT relating to the filing of papers in cases argued before the Supreme Judicial Court when sitting as a Court of Law.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

In each case argued before the law court counsel shall 2 file with the clerk of the district in which such case is heard 3 three copies of their respective briefs, if printed, and the 4 clerk at the expense of his county shall cause the same to 5 be bound in three equal volumes of convenient size, prop-6 erly paged, indexed and labelled, and shall deposit one 7 each of said volumes in the respective county law libraries 8 at Augusta, Bangor and Portland.

The above is a true copy of a Resolution brought before the Cumberland Bar Association at its annual meeting January 22, 1901, when following action was taken by association on same:

Voted, That said Resolution be adopted and approved by the association.

Voted, That Brother Freeman be requested to forward above Resolution to some member of legislature, asking for its passage, accompanied by a certified copy of approval of association, from the Secretary.
