## STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE granting a pension to Nellie Flanders of Liberty.

Resolved, That there be paid to Nellie Flanders of the 2 town of Liberty, a pension of eight dollars per month for 3 the period of one year commencing January 1, 1901.



#### STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Mrs. Flanders is the widow of George C. Flanders who enlisted from the State of New Hampshire, in a New Hampshire regiment and therefore she cannot obtain a state pension. She was married in 1887, and supposed in good faith that her husband was a single man, when in fact, he had a wife living. His first wife died in 1899, and last June Mrs. Flanders was married to the said George C. Flanders again and her marriage was confirmed by the court at January term, Waldo county. The said Nellie C. Flanders has six children and was left no property.
