STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND ONE.

AN ACT to amend chapter 495 of the Private and Special Laws of 1893, entitled "An Act to prevent the destruction of fish in the Eastern Penobscot river in the town of Orland."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section one of chapter four hundred and ninety-
2 five of the Private and Special Laws of eighteen hundred and
3 ninety-three is hereby amended by striking out the word
4 "Saturday" in the fifth line thereof and inserting in place
5 thereof the word 'Sunday,' so that said section, as amended,
6 shall read as follows:

'Sect. 1. From and after the passage of this act no person
8 shall be allowed to take any alewives in the Eastern Penob-
9 scot river, within the town of Orland, in the county of

10 Hancock, with any large net, seine, spears, scoop nets, or in
11 any weirs between sunrise on Sunday of each week and sun-
12 rise on Monday of each week under a penalty of twenty
13 cents for each and every alewife so taken.'

Sect. 2. Section seven of said chapter four hundred and
2 ninety-five is hereby amended by striking out the word "Sat-
3 urday" in the fourth line thereof and inserting in place
4 thereof the word 'Sunday,' so that said section, as amended,
5 shall read as follows:

'Sect. 7. All weirs on said river now built or which shall
7 be built, shall be constructed with a suitable gate, which gate
8 the owner or occupant of said weir shall keep open from
9 sunrise on Sunday of each week until sunrise on Monday of
10 each week, under a penalty of ten dollars, to be forfeited by
11 said owners or occupants for each and every day they shall
12 refuse or neglect so to keep open said gate.'
