STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND ONE.

AN ACT to incorporate the town of Millinocket.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. So much of Indian Township numbered
2 three in the County of Penobscot as is bounded as follows,
3 viz: Beginning in the east line of said township at
4 the southeasterly corner of lot numbered thirty-two in
5 said township and running thence westerly on the
6 northerly lines of lots numbered fifty-two, fifty-one, fifty,
7 forty-nine and forty-eight to the northwesterly corner
8 thereof; thence southerly on the westerly lines of lots
9 numbered forty-eight, fifty-nine, sixty-nine and ninety-

10 eight to the west branch of the Penobscot river ; thence
11 following the thread of said west branch of the Penobscot
12 river to the east line of said township ; thence northerly
13 on the east line of said township to the southeasterly
14 corner of said lot thirty-two, the place of beginning, is
15 hereby incorporated as a town under the name of Milli-
16 nocket, and the inhabitants thereof are hereby invested
17 with all the powers and privileges and subject to all the
18 duties and liabilities incident to other towns in this State.

Sect. 2. Any justice of the peace may call the first
2 meeting of the town of Millinocket by posting a warrant
3 therefor, stating the objects of said meeting, in three
4 public and conspicuous places in said town at least seven
5 days before the time of holding said meeting.

Sect. 3. Said town of Millinocket is hereby authorized
2 to contract for a supply of water for sanitary, municipal
3 and other public purposes, including the extinguishment
4 of fires, upon such terms and conditions as the said town
5 may deem fit and proper ; and to enter into contract with
6 any lighting company for lighting the streets and other
7 places in said town under municipal control.

Sect. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.
