# STATE OF MAINE.

## RESOLVE in favor of William J. Maybury, Surgeon General, National Guard, State of Maine.

Resolved, That there be paid to Dr. William J. May-2 bury, Surgeon General, National Guard, state of Maine, 3 the sum of seven hundred and forty-two dollars and thirty-4 one cents, being amount disbursed by him for soldiers of 5 the Spanish war. • • •

#### STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Bills to the full amount of this resolve have been presented and examined by the committee, with vouchers for the same; a large amount of this claim is for cash paid out by Colonel Maybury in caring for sick soldiers of the First Maine Volunteers returning home from Chickamauga, and those of the Signal Corps from Santiago, who were taken off the trains at Biddeford and Saco, and as there was no United States surgeon in either place it became necessary that Colonel Maybury should care for them. The state is to be reimbursed by the national government some time in the future and your committee thinks the state should care for this bill.
