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## STATE OF MAINE.

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RESOLVE providing for the Topographical Survey for the years 1901 and 1902 and for the Geological Survey.

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*Resolved,* That there be and hereby is appropriated, for 2 the work of the topographic survey commission for the 3 years 1901 and 1902, including clerical work and ex- 4 penses, the sum of five thousand dollars.

The direction and control of the geological survey of the 6 state is hereby vested in said commission, and said com- 7 mission is hereby authorized and directed to confer with 8 the director of the U. S. geological survey, and invite an 9 early beginning of the work.



### STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The appropriation called for by accompanying resolve is for the same amount as was provided in the original resolve passed at the last session of the legislature, and is equalled by the U. S. government.

The geological survey is made wholly at the expense of the general government, after a topographic survey is made.

The commissioners hope, if authority be granted them as proposed, to induce the government to begin the survey at an early date, in such parts of the state as are covered by the topographic survey.
