STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THREE.

AN ACT to extend the powers of the Katahdin Pulp and Paper
Company.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. The Katahdin Pulp and Paper Company, a cor-
2 poration organized under the general laws of the State, in
3 addition to the powers which it already possesses, is hereby
4 authorized and empowered to manufacture lumber of all
5 kinds; to buy, sell and otherwise deal in the manufactured
6 products of lumber; to carry on lumber operations in the
7 woods, and to supply others carrying on such operations; and
8 to buy and sell logs and other lumber. Said company is also
9 authorized and empowered to generate and create electricity

10 and other power for manufacturing and other purposes
11 within the town of Lincoln, in the county of Penobscot, and
12 to lease or sell the same, also to supply the inhabitants of said
13 town, or any village corporation within said town, with water;
14 lights and heat for domestic, sanitary and municipal purposes,
15 including the extinguishment of fires, and generally to do all
16 things necessary and convenient for carrying on the business
17 of the company, including the carrying on of a general mer-
18 cantile business in connection with any of the purposes of the
19 company.

Sect. 2. The acts and doings of the stockholders and direc-
2 tors of said company in building and equipping its saw mill
3 at said Lincoln, are hereby ratified, confirmed and made valid.

Sect. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
