## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND THREE.

---

AN ACT to amend section ten of chapter nineteen of the Revised  
Statutes, relating to the Law of the Road.

---

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in  
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section ten of chapter nineteen of the Revised Statutes is  
2 hereby amended by inserting after the word "thereon" in the  
3 sixth line thereof, the following: 'And all teams with wheels,  
4 if drawn by more than two horses, oxen or mules, must have  
5 the rims of their wheels at least six inches wide, when travel-  
6 ling on the road from Lawton's Quarry in Smithfield, in  
7 Somerset county, to Norridgewock village.' So that said  
8 section as amended shall read as follows:

‘Sect. 10. Teams with wheels, if drawn by more than two  
10 horses, oxen or mules, must have the rims of their wheels at  
11 least four inches wide, and if drawn by more than four horses,  
12 oxen or mules, at least five inches wide, when travelling on  
13 the road from Jackson Brook, in Washington county, to  
14 Forest City; and no team drawn by more than six horses,  
15 oxen or mules, shall travel thereon. And all teams with  
16 wheels, if drawn by more than two horses, oxen or mules,  
17 must have the rims of their wheels at least six inches wide,  
18 when travelling on the road from Lawton’s Quarry in Smith-  
19 field, in Somerset county, to Norridgewock village. This  
20 section is not applicable to stage or pleasure carriages, or to  
21 those owned by the State or the United States, or to any cart  
22 or wagon owned by the settlers in the vicinity and used for  
23 farming purposes. The owner or driver of a team violating  
24 this section forfeits twenty dollars, and one dollar more for  
25 each mile of road passed, to be recovered by complaint before  
26 a trial justice in the county where the offense was committed,  
27 and on a libel or complaint he may issue his warrant to seize  
28 and detain such team to respond to such fine and costs.’
