STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THREE.

AN ACT to extend the franchises held by the Wiscasset, Waterville and Farmington Railroad Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. All the rights, powers and privileges of 2 the Franklin, Somerset and Kennebec Railway Company, 3 now held by the Wiscasset, Waterville and Farmington 4 Railroad Company which were granted by chapter four 5 hundred and sixty-seven of the private and special laws for 6 one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, are hereby 7 extended to January first, one thousand nine hundred and 8 five.

- Sect. 2. All of the rights, powers and privileges of 2 the Waterville and Wiscasset Railroad Company, now held 3 by the Wiscasset, Waterville and Farmington Railroad 4 Company which were granted by chapter three hundred 5 and seventeen of the laws of one thousand eight hundred 6 and ninety-five are hereby extended to January first, one 7 thousand nine hundred and five.
- Sect. 3. All the rights, powers, privileges and immuni2 ties conferred upon the Wiscasset and Quebec Railroad
 3 Company by section two of chapter one hundred and
 4 twenty-six of the private and special laws for one thou5 sand eight hundred and ninety-nine are hereby conferred
 6 upon the Wiscasset, Waterville and Farmington Railroad
 7 Company as successor to the Wiscasset and Quebec Rail8 road Company and the said Wiscasset, Waterville and
 9 Farmington Railroad Company is hereby given two years
 10 from the approval of this act for the location and con11 struction of its road as therein and thereby authorized.
 - Sect. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.
