STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THREE.

AN ACT concerning Attorneys at Law.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Sections 27, 28, 29 and 30 of Chapter 79 of 2 the Revised Statutes of 1883 are hereby amended so as to

3 give any Justice of the Supreme Judicial Court, in term

4 time or in vacation, the powers therein conferred upon the

5 court, and said sections, as amended, shall read as follows:

Sect. 27. If an attorney at law receives money or any 7 valuable thing on a claim left with him for collection or 8 settlement, and fails to account for and pay over the same 9 to the claimant for ten days after demand, he is guilty of 10 a breach of duty as an attorney; and such claimant may 11 file in the office of the clerk of the supreme judicial court 12 in the county where such attorney resides, a motion in 13 writing, under oath, setting forth the facts; and there14 upon any justice of the supreme judicial court in term time 15 or in vacation shall issue a rule, requiring the attorney to 16 appear on a day fixed and show cause why he should not 17 so account and pay, and to abide the order of such justice 18 in the premises; which shall be served by copy in hand at 19 least five days before the return day.

Sect. 28. If he then appears, he shall file an answer to 21 such motion, under oath, and such justice may examine 22 the parties and other evidence pertinent thereto. If he 23 does not appear and answer, the facts set forth in the motion 24 shall be taken as confessed; and in either case such justice 25 shall render such decree as equity requires.

Sect. 29. Either party may allege exceptions to any 27 ruling or decree of such justice; and they shall be allowed 28 unless deemed frivolous.

Sect. 30. If the attorney does not perform the decree 30 of such justice, he shall be committed for contempt until 31 he does, or is otherwise lawfully discharged; and his name 32 shall be struck from the roll of attorneys.

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
