STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THREE.

AN ACT for the better protection of shell fish within the town of Georgetown.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. No shell fish shall be taken from any flats 2 within the limits of the town of Georgetown, in Sagadahoc 3 county, except by written permit of the municipal officers 4 of the town and payment to the town for the privilege at 5 such price as said town may establish at any town meeting, any existing law to the contrary notwithstanding; 7 provided, that without such permit, any inhabitant within 8 said town, or any person temporarily resident therein, or

- 9 the riparian owner of such flats, may take therefrom for 10 the immediate use of himself or his family, not exceeding 11 one bushel at any one tide.
 - Sect. 2. Any person taking shell fish contrary to the 2 provisions of this act, shall be punished for each offense 3 by a fine not exceeding ten dollars, or by imprisonment 4 not exceeding thirty days, or by both, and it shall be the 5 duty of the municipal officers of Georgetown to make 6 complaint for any violation of this act.
