STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THREE.

AN ACT to fix qualification for participation in party caucuses, and providing for notice of caucuses.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section I. No person shall participate in any caucus of 2 any political party unless qualified therefor by enrollment as 3 hereinafter provided. Any person violating this section, or
- 4 making any wilfully false statement of fact in his declaration
- 5 of enrollment, shall be punished by fine not exceeding five
- 6 hundred dollars or by imprisonment not exceeding six 7 months.
- Sect. 2. Any person who is a legally qualified voter, may 2 enroll himself as a member of any political party by filing 3 with the clerk of the town where he resides, a declaration in 4 writing, signed by him, of his election to enroll himself as a

5 member of the party designated by him, which declaration 6 shall be substantially as follows:

I — being a legally qualified voter of the — 8 of — hereby elect to enroll myself as a member of the 9 — party. The following statement of name, resi10 dence, place of last enrollment if any, and party of last enroll11 ment, if any, is true.

Name. City or town of Place of last Party of last residence. Street. Number. enrollment. enrollment.

(Signature)

A new enrollment may be made at any time. But after 13 such new enrollment, if a different party be designated, the 14 person making such new enrollment shall not be entitled to 15 participate in any caucus of such newly designated party for 16 the period of six months after his enrollment therein.

Sect. 3. The clerk of the town where the enrollment is 2 made as above provided shall receive and file the same, 3 indorsing thereon the date of filing, and shall record the 4 name, residence, place of last enrollment, party of last enrollment, and date of filing, in a separate book for the enrollment 6 of members of each political party, entering the names alphabetically.

Suitable blanks for filing such enrollment shall be provided 9 by the town clerks, and in addition thereto they shall provide 10 books with proper headings embodying the enrollment state-11 ments above provided, which the person desiring to enroll 12 may sign and fill out, thereby enrolling himself with the same 13 effect as by filing such enrollment paper.

Such books shall be public records, and shall at all times be 15 open to public inspection.

Sect. 4. Notices of caucuses, signed by the chairman and 2 secretary shall be issued by each town committee not less than 3 seven days prior to the day on which the caucuses are to be 4 held.

They shall be conspicuously posted in at least five places on 6 the highways or streets of each voting precinct and shall state 7 the place, day and hour of holding such caucuses.

In case voting is by use of check lists a sufficient time shall 9 be allowed for all to vote, and the call for the caucus shall 10 state the hours fixed by the committee for the opening and 11 closing of the poll.

Sect. 5. This act shall take effect July first, 1903.
