STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THREE.

AN ACT relating to the taking of lobsters within three miles of the islands of Matinicus and Criehaven, during the months of August and September, in each year.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. No person shall take, catch, kill or destroy any
2 lobster or lobsters within three miles of the islands of Matini-
3 cus and Criehaven, between the first day of August and the
4 first day of October in each and every year.

Sect. 2. Any person violating the provisions of the fore-
2 going section shall be punished by a fine of one dollar for
3 each and every lobster taken, caught, killed or destroyed
4 contrary to the provisions of the foregoing section. Trial
5 justices and judges of police and municipal courts shall have
6 jurisdiction of all offenses under this act.

Sect. 3. This act shall take effect on the first day of
2 August, nineteen hundred and three.
