STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THREE.

AN ACT to amend section three of chapter one hundred and
three of the Public Laws of 1895, relating to Telegraph and
Telephone Companies.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section three of chapter one hundred and three of the Public
2 Laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-five is hereby amended
3 by striking out the following words after the word "incorpo-
4 ration" in the fifth line thereof, viz: "But no corporation
5 organized hereunder shall have authority without special act
6 of the legislature, to construct its lines along the route or
7 routes, used or authorized to be used, by any other telegraph
8 or telephone company, person or firm, or between points
9 connected, or authorized to be connected, by the lines of any

10 such company, person or firm, unless it shall first obtain the
11 consent of such other company, person or firm;” so that said
12 section as amended shall read as follows:

‘Sect. 3. Corporations organized under the provisions of
14 this act shall have authority, except as herein limited, to
15 construct, maintain and operate lines upon and along the
16 route or routes and between the points stated in its certificate
17 of incorporation.’
