STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THREE.

AN ACT to amend chapter two hundred and seventy-three of the public laws of 1885 relating to the holding of county teachers' conventions.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Chapter two hundred and seventy-three of 2 the public laws of 1885 is hereby amended by inserting 3 after the word "counties" in the fourth line of section two 4 of said chapter the following words, viz:—'and also for 5 not more than two days in any year during the sessions of 6 any state teachers' convention approved by the state 7 superintendent of public schools,' so that said section, as 8 amended by this act, shall read as follows:

- 'Sect. 2. Teachers of public schools are hereby author10 ized to suspend their schools for not more than two days
 11 in any year during the sessions of such conventions within
 12 their counties and also for not more than two days in any
 13 year during the sessions of any state teachers' convention
 14 approved by the state superintendent of public schools,
 15 unless otherwise directed in writing by the school officers
 16 and attend said conventions without forfeiture of pay for
 17 the time of such attendance, provided they shall present
 18 to the officers employing them certificates signed by the
 19 secretaries of such conventions and countersigned by the
 20 state superintendent of (common) public schools showing
 21 such attendance.'
- Sect. 2. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with 2 this act are hereby repealed.
