## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THREE.

AN ACT amendatory to section six (6) of chapter four hundred and ninety-five (495) of the Special Laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-five (1885), entitled "An Act to Incorporate the People's Ferry Company."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section six (6) of chapter four hundred and 2 ninety-five (495) of the Special Laws of eighteen hundred 3 and eighty-five (1885) is nereby amended so that said 4 section, as amended, shall read as follows:

'The time for running said boat or boats, unless pre-6 vented by accident or unavoidable casualty shall on week 7 days be not later than six o'clock in the forenoon and not 8 less than two round trips per hour shall be run up to and 9 until six and one-half o'clock in the afternoon and on 10 Sundays the time for running shall be not later than eight 11 o'clock in the forenoon and not less than two round trips 12 per hour shall be run up to and until six o'clock in the 13 afternoon.

And the said People's Ferry Company is hereby given 15 the further power and authority to run as many other 16 trips before, after and during the above mentioned hours 17 as it may deem for its best interests in addition to those 18 required, using for these trip or trips a boat or boats for 19 teams, freight and passengers or a boat or boats for pas-20 sengers and freight only as the said company may deem 21 expedient.'

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
