STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THREE.

AN ACT to provide for the Recording of Plans.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. The county commissioners at the expense 2 of the several counties shall provide suitable books of the 3 best quality of tracing cloth, interleaved with white paper 4 and substantially bound, for the recording of such plans 5 as may be presented for record; and shall provide other 6 books of substantial binding with "stubs" for the inser-7 tion and preservation of such plans as it may not be 8 expedient to copy into the books first mentioned.

In all cases where a plan is to be copied in the first named 10 books the register of deeds may employ a competent 11 draftsman at a fair compensation to make such copy, and 12 shall receive for examining and certifying the same the 13 sum of fifty cents in addition to the amount paid for mak-14 ing record, and a like sum for furnishing copies from the 15 record.

Said commissioners shall also cause to be made a suit-17 able index to all plans on record, whether filed and 18 recorded before or after the passage of this act.

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
