STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THREE.

AN ACT to amend an act entitled “ An Act to Authorize
the Opening of a Second Channel of Mousam River.”

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows :*

Section 1. Section 1 of chapter ninety-two of the
2 Private and Special Laws of 1887, is hereby amended by
3 striking out after the word “river” in the ninth line of said
4 section, and inserting in place thereof the following: ‘and
5 should it prove necessary for the economical execution of
6 above purpose, they are authorized to build dams or other
7 artificial obstructions required, so that said section as
8 amended shall read as follows :

‘Section 1. Hartley Lord, Robert W. Lord, Owen
10 Wentworth, Emery Andrews and Sidney T. Fuller,
11 together with such persons as they shall associate with
12 themselves, their heirs and assigns, are hereby authorized
13 and empowered to cut a channel from any point below
14 Clay Hill bridge, so called, in Mousam river, so called,
15 in Kennebunk, through the lands of Owen Wentworth
16 and others, to the Cove, so called, which lies easterly of
17 Gillespies point, so that sail and row boats may pass to
18 and from said cove into said river, and should it prove
19 necessary for the economical execution of above purpose,
20 they are authorized to build dams or other artificial
21 obstructions of any kind required.’
