STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THREE.

AN ACT relating to street railroad locations.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Whenever a location for a street railroad 2 upon any street, road or way has been approved under the 3 general law or any special act with no actual occupation 4 thereof by the rails of such company, such location in 5 whole or a part may be cancelled at any time by the manicifical pal officers of the town where so located upon the petition 7 of the directors of the corporation entitled to the same.

Sect. 2. Any street railroad corporation, under the 2 direction of the railroad commissioners, may make any 3 changes in the location of its road which it deems necessary 4 or expedient and such changes shall be recorded where the 5 original location was required by law to be recorded.
