STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THREE.

AN ACT to amend section twenty-nine of chapter eighteen
of the Revised Statutes, relating to ways across station
grounds of railroads.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section twenty-nine of chapter eighteen of the Revised
2 Statutes is hereby amended so that the same shall read as
3 follows:

‘Sect. 29. No way shall be laid out through or across
5 any land or right of way of any railroad corporation, used
6 for station purposes, unless after notice and hearing the
7 railroad commissioners adjudge that public convenience

8 and necessity require it. When the tribunal having juris-
9 diction over the laying out of such way is satisfied, after
10 hearing, that public convenience and necessity require such
11 laying out, such proceedings shall be suspended and peti-
12 tion filed by such tribunal with the railroad commissioners
13 for their adjudication hereunder.'
