

STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE to provide for the expenses of the Maine Industrial School for Girls.

Resolved, That the sum of ten thousand five hundred dol2 lars be and the same hereby is appropriated for the year nine3 teen hundred three and the same for the year nineteen
4 hundred four. And for ordinary repairs and additional help
5 on the farm the sum of five hundred dollars is hereby appro6 priated for the year nineteen hundred three and the same for
7 the year nineteen hundred four. And for the expenses of
8 the trustees of the said school the sum of five hundred dollars
9 hereby is appropriated for the year nineteen hundred three
10 and the same for the year nineteen hundred four.



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

These sums are the sums which have been hitherto appropriated for the purposes stated. There are three buildings, and the State has made an annual appropriation of \$3,500 for each building.

One man cannot attend to the care of steam and hot water heating, the stock, the cultivation of a sufficient garden and, as needed, the conveyance and custody of the girls. The sum of \$500 was appropriated for the year 1901 and the same for the year 1902 to provide additional help and ordinary repairs. The same amount is asked for for the next two years.

The Board of Trustees consist of six persons. They are allowed for their services "their actual expenses and two dollars a day, when actually employed." The sum of five hundred dollars has hitherto been appropriated, and is needed, for their expenses and compensation.
