STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THREE.

AN ACT relating to Gorham Academy.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. The trustees of the Gorham Academy in the 2 courty of Cumberland, a corporation created in eighteen 3 hundred and three is hereby continued with all the powers 4 and privileges thereto belonging, the same as though 5 chapter three hundred and seventy-four of the Special 6 Laws of eighteen hundred and fifty, entitled "An Act to 7 change Gorham Academy to a female seminary," and 8 chapter forty-three of the Special Laws of eighteen hun-

9 dred and sixty-one, entitled "An Act to amend an act to 10 change Gorham Academy to a female seminary approved 11 August twentieth, eighteen hundred and fifty" had not 12 been passed.

Sect. 2. Said academy shall be devoted exclusively to 2 the education of boys.

Sect. 3. The present trustees of the Gorham Seminary, 2 with such associates and successors as they may from time 3 to time elect, are hereby constituted the trustees of the 4 Gorham Academy. They may determine the number of 5 trustees, the tenure of office and what number shall con-6 stitute a quorum of the board of said trustees, and how 7 many thereof shall be residents of Gorham.

Sect. 4. All the property of the Gorham Seminary 2 shall vest in and revert so the trustees of the Gorham 3 Academy in the county of Cumberland, whenever the 4 trustees of said seminary shall vote to accept this act.

Sect. 5. Said academy corporation shall be allowed to 2 hold real and personal property to the amount of five 3 hundred thousand dollars.

Sect. 6. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with 2 this act are hereby repealed.
