STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THREE.

AN ACT to regulate the taking of codfish, pollock, hake, and haddock in the waters of Frenchmans bay.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. No person shall use more than one trawl, not 2 exceeding five hundred hooks for the purpose of taking or 3 destroying any codfish, pollock, hake or haddock, in the 4 waters of Frenchmans bay inside or northerly of a straight 5 line drawn from the south side of Round or Bald Porcupine 6 island to the south end of Jordans island.

Sect. 2. Any person violating the provisions of this act shall 2 be liable to a fine of ten dollars for each offence.

Sect. 3. This act shall take effect on the first day of April, 2 one thousand nine hundred and three.
