IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND THREE.

---

AN ACT to regulate the taking of codfish, pollock, hake, and  
haddock in the waters of Frenchmans bay.

---

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in  
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. No person shall use more than one trawl, not  
2 exceeding five hundred hooks for the purpose of taking or  
3 destroying any codfish, pollock, hake or haddock, in the  
4 waters of Frenchmans bay inside or northerly of a straight  
5 line drawn from the south side of Round or Bald Porcupine  
6 island to the south end of Jordans island.

Sect. 2. Any person violating the provisions of this act shall  
2 be liable to a fine of ten dollars for each offence.

Sect. 3. This act shall take effect on the first day of April,  
2 one thousand nine hundred and three.
