
IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THREE.

AN ACT in regard to compensation of Town Officers.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Towns having four thousand or more inhabitants shall have 2 the right to vote their selectmen a per diem compensation, 3 not exceeding five (\$5.00) dollars per day, for time actually 4 spent in the service of the town.
