IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THREE.

AN ACT to amend section I of chapter 30 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter 115 of the Public Laws of 1895, and sections 3 and 4 of chapter 30 of the Revised Statutes, in relation to dogs.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1 of chapter 30 of the Revised Statutes as amended

- 2 by chapter 115 of the Public Laws of 1895 is hereby amended 3 by inserting after the word "done" in the fifth line of said
- 4 section the words 'provided said damage was not occasioned
- 5 through the fault of the person injured,' so that said section
- 6 as amended shall read as follows:

'Towns may pass by-laws, to regulate the going at large of

- 8 dogs therein. When a dog does damage to a person or his
- 9 property, his owner or keeper and also the parent, guardian,
- 10 master, or mistress of any minor who owns or keeps such
- 11 dog, forfeits to the person injured the amount of the damage
- 12 done, provided said damage was not occasioned through the

13 fault of the person injured; to be recovered by action of tres-14 pass.'

Section 3 of chapter 30 of the Revised Statutes is hereby 16 amended so it shall read as follows:

'Whoever is so assaulted or finds a dog strolling outside of 18 the premises or immediate care of its owner or keeper, may, 10 within forty-eight hours thereafter, make written complaint 20 before the municipal or police court having jurisdiction in 21 the city or town where the owner or keeper resides, or in case 22 there is no such court, before a trial justice in said town, 23 that he really believes and has reason to believe said dog to 24 be dangerous or vicious; whereupon said court or trial justice 25 shall order said owner or keeper to appear and answer to 26 said complaint by serving said owner or keeper of said dog 27 with a copy of said complaint and order a reasonable time 28 before the day set for a hearing thereon; and if upon hearing, 29 the court or trial justice is satisfied that said complaint is 30 true, he shall order said owner or keeper within twenty-four 31 hours thereafter either to kill or confine said dog or remove 32 and keep same beyond the limits of said town or city; and if 33 said owner or keeper neglects to comply with said order, he 34 shall forfeit to the use of the city or town aforesaid not less 35 than one nor more than ten dollars, to be recovered in an 36 action on the case.'

Section 4 of chapter 30 of the Revised Statutes is hereby 38 amended by striking out in the first line of said section the 39 words "after notice so given" and inserting in place thereof 40 the words 'whose owner or keeper neglects to comply with 41 said order,' so that said section as amended shall read as 42 follows:

'If a dog, whose owner or keeper neglects to comply with 44 said order, wounds any person by a sudden assault as afore-45 said, or wounds or kills any domestic animal, the owner or 46 keeper shall pay the person injured treble damages and costs.'
