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## STATE OF MAINE.

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND THREE.

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AN ACT to incorporate the Boothbay Harbor Electric Light  
and Power Company.

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*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in  
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. Luther Maddocks of Boothbay Harbor, E. W.  
2 Gross of Auburn and Frank Ridlon of Boston, Massachusetts,  
3 are hereby incorporated under the name of the Boothbay  
4 Harbor Electric Light and Power Company.

Sect. 2. Said corporation is hereby authorized to make,  
2 generate, sell, distribute and supply electricity for lighting,  
3 heating, manufacturing and mechanical purposes in the towns  
4 of Boothbay Harbor, Boothbay, Southport, Edgecomb and  
5 Wiscasset, with all the rights and powers and subject to all

6 the duties and liabilities of similar corporations organized  
7 under the general laws of the state.

Sect. 3. The capital stock shall not exceed one hundred  
2 thousand dollars, to be fixed by the corporation from time to  
3 time.

Sect. 4. The said corporation is authorized to purchase the  
2 property rights and privileges of the E. W. Gross Company,  
3 used in supplying electricity in said Boothbay Harbor and  
4 Boothbay and on such purchase it shall succeed to and enjoy  
5 all such rights and privileges of said firm and be subject to  
6 all liabilities whether imposed by law or by contract or other-  
7 wise.

Sect. 5. The location of the posts, wires and fixtures of the  
2 said E. W. Gross Company in the streets of said Boothbay,  
3 Harbor and Boothbay, and its municipal contracts are hereby  
4 confirmed and made valid.

Sect. 6. The towns aforesaid, or any municipal corpora-  
2 tion therein, are authorized to contract with said corporation  
3 for a supply of electricity for municipal purposes for a term  
4 of years, and to renew the same, and to raise money therefor.

Sect. 7. The said corporation, for the purposes of this act,  
2 is authorized to issue its bonds from time to time in such  
3 amounts and on such rates and time, as it may deem expe-  
4 dient, and secure the same by appropriate mortgages upon  
5 its franchises.

Sect. 8. The first meeting may be called by written notice  
2 therefor naming the time and place signed by either of said  
3 corporators and sent by mail or given in hand to the other  
4 corporators three days before such meeting. Any corpora-  
5 tor may act at such meeting by written proxy.

Sect. 9. This act shall take effect when approved.
