STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THREE.

AN ACT to amend section sixteen of chapter two hundred and
sixty-six of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-
three, relating to the Militia.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section sixteen of said act is hereby amended by striking out
2 the words "in case of war, insurrection or invasion," so that
3 said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 16. The staff of the commander-in-chief shall consist
5 of the adjutant general, who shall be ex-officio chief of staff,
6 quartermaster general and paymaster general with the rank
7 of major general; an inspector general, with the rank of
8 brigadier general; a commissary general, a surgeon general,

9 a judge advocate general, and an inspector general of rifle
10 practice, each with the rank of colonel; two aides-de-camp
11 with the rank of lieutenant colonel, and a military secretary
12 with the rank of major. Provided, however, that the com-
13 mander-in-chief may appoint such additional staff officers as
14 the public service shall require, and with such rank as he may
15 designate. The staff of the commander-in-chief shall be
16 appointed and commissioned by him and shall hold office
17 during his pleasure and until their successors are appointed
18 and qualified.'
