STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THREE.

AN ACT to amend section 6 of chapter 3 of the Public Laws of 1899 entitled "An Act to amend section 6 of chapter 156 of the Public Laws of 1895 entitled 'An Act to amend section 6 of chapter 35 of the Revised Statutes, relating to intelligence offices.'"

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section 6 of chapter 3 of the Public Laws of 2 1899 is hereby amended by striking out in the second line 3 thereof the words "one dollar each" and inserting in place 4 thereof the words "the sum of five dollars each into the town 5 treasury;" and by striking out in the tenth line thereof the 6 words, "in excess of one dollar;" and by inserting in the

7 thirteenth line thereof after the word "furnished," the words
8 'no license shall be granted to a person who is directly or
9 indirectly engaged or interested in the sale of intoxicating
10 liquors,' so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 6. The municipal officers of any town may on pay-
12 ment of the sum of five dollars each into the town treasury
13 grant licenses to suitable persons for one year, unless sooner
14 revoked after notice and for cause, to keep officers for the
15 purposes of obtaining employment for domestics, servants,
16 or other laborers, except seamen, or of giving information
17 relating thereto, or of doing the usual business of intelligence
18 offices; whoever keeps such an office, without a license, for-
19 feits not exceeding fifty dollars for every day that it is so
20 kept. The keeper of an intelligence office shall not retain any
21 sum of money received from any person seeking employment
22 through the agency of such intelligence office, unless employ-
23 ment of the kind sought for is actually furnished.

No license shall be granted to a person who is directly or
25 indirectly engaged in or interested in the sale of intoxicating
26 liquors. The keeper of a licenses intelligence office shall
27 cause two copies of this act, printed in type of sufficient size
28 to be legible and easily read, to be conspicuously posted in
29 each room used or occupied for the purposes of such intelli-
30 gence office. Whoever violates the provisions of this act
31 shall have the license revoked, and shall be punished by fine
32 not exceeding twenty dollars for each offence.

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
