### STATE OF MAINE.

### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THREE.

AN ACT to amend section eleven of chapter fifty-eight of the Revised Statutes, relating to the stipend paid from the State Treasury to Agricultural Societies.

# Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section eleven of chapter fifty-eight of the Revised Statutes, 2 as amended by chapter three hundred and fifty-one of the

- 3 Public Laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-five, and by
- 4 chapter one hundred and eighty-six of the Public Laws of
- 5 eighteen hundred and eighty-nine, and by chapter forty-two
- 6 of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-five, and
- 7 by chapter two hundred and eighty-eight of the Public Laws
- 8 of eighteen hundred and ninety-seven, is hereby further
- 9 amended by inserting after the word "chance," in the next

10 to the last line of said section, the words 'or any immoral or 11 indecent show, exhibition or performance,' so that said section, as amended, shall read as follows:

'Sect. 11. There shall be appropriated annually from the 14 State treasury, a sum of money not exceeding one cent to 15 each inhabitant of the State, which shall be divided among 16 the legally incorporated agricultural societies of the State not 17 provided for by special enactment, according to the amount 18 of premiums and gratuities actually paid in full by said soci-. 19 eties, provided that the stipend shall herewith be based 20 entirely upon the premiums and gratuities actually paid in 21 full on exhibition stocks and products, and provided that no 22 society shall receive from the State a sum greater than that 23 actually raised and paid by the society for said purpose. 24 the Penobscot and Aroostook Union Agricultural Society 25 may annually receive as much as is raised by it, not exceeding 26 one hundred dollars, without regard to population; and the 27 Waldo and Penobscot Agricultural Society as much as is 28 raised by it, not exceeding two hundred and fifty dollars; 29 and the Ossipee Valley Union Agricultural Society, not 30 exceeding two hundred dollars; provided also, that each of 31 the said societies shall cause the prohibitory liquor law to be 32 enforced on all grounds over which they have control, and 33 not allow gambling in any form, or games of chance, or any 34 immoral or indecent show, exhibition or performance, on 35 said grounds.'
