STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the town of Trescott.

Resolved, That the sum of three hundred dollars be and is
2 hereby appropriated, to wit, one hundred and fifty dollars for
3 the year nineteen hundred and three, and one hundred and
4 fifty dollars for the year nineteen hundred and four, to aid
5 the town of Trescott in maintaining its roads and bridges,
6 said sums to be expended under the direction of the county
7 commissioners of Washington county.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The town of Trescott has twenty-seven miles of road and seven bridges. Population, 485. The bridges were badly injured by the freshet last fall. The rate of taxation averages .46 mills and the interest-bearing debt, \$3,250.00, have no manufacturing industries and is dependent on farming and shore fishing.
