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## STATE OF MAINE.

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND THREE.

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AN ACT to amend chapter 358 of the Private and Special Laws of the State of Maine for the year 1867, as amended by the Private and Special Laws of the State of Maine for the year 1868, relative to the charter of the Great Works Dam Company, and the change of the name thereof.

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*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 3 of chapter 358 of the Private and Special Laws of 1867 as amended by the Private and Special Laws of the State of Maine for the year 1868 is amended by adding to the said section 3 the following words, to wit:

'Said driving season is to end June tenth of each year, or  
6 such time thereafter as the Bangor boom may be hung and  
7 ready to receive logs, and whenever logs are driven out of  
8 said stream, said dam company is to cause all gates on its  
9 dam at the foot of Great Works meadow to be hoisted and  
10 securely fastened with chains and padlocks and to be so main-  
11 tained until it becomes necessary to lower said gates to accu-  
12 mulate water for log driving purposes only,' so that said sec-  
13 tion when amended will read as follows:

'Sect. 3. The sole object of this act being to provide for  
15 the navigation of said stream for driving logs or lumber, all  
16 persons interested in the waters of said stream or in lands  
17 contiguous thereto as riparian proprietors or otherwise shall  
18 have and enjoy all and the same rights in every respect as if  
19 this act had not been passed, except so far only as shall be  
20 necessary for the purposes aforesaid during the driving sea-  
21 sons, said driving season is to end June tenth of each year,  
22 or such time thereafter as the Bangor boom may be hung and  
23 ready to receive logs, and whenever logs are driven out of  
24 said stream, said dam company is to cause all gates on its  
25 dam at the foot of Great Works meadow to be hoisted and  
26 securely fastened with chains and padlocks and to be so main-  
27 tained until it becomes necessary to lower said gates to accu-  
28 mulate water for log driving purposes only.'
