AN ACT to extend the charter of Sebasticook Manufacturing and Power Company.


Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. That the rights, powers and privileges of the

- 2 Sebasticook Manufacturing and Power Company, which were
- 3 granted by chapter eighty-six of the Private and Special
- 4 Laws of one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine and
- 5 extended for the term of two years by chapter four hundred
- 6 seventeen of the Private and Special Laws of one thousand
- 7 nine hundred and one, are hereby further extended for and
- 8 during a term of two years from the date of the approval of
- 9 this act, with the exception of the right to manufacture, gen-

10 erate, sell, distribute and supply electricity for lighting pur11 poses in the town of Clinton, and with the further exception
12 that said company shall have no right to flow any mill privi13 lege upon which a dam is now built without the consent of
14 the owners thereof. The persons named in said act, their
15 associates and successors, shall have all the rights, powers
16 and privileges that were granted them thereby to be exercised
17 in the same manner and for the same purposes as specified
18 therein, except as modified by this act.

- Sect. 2. Said company is also authorized to engage in man-2 ufacturing with all the rights and powers and subject to all 3 the restrictions and liabilities incident to manufacturing cor-4 porations under the laws of this State.
 - Sect. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
