STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of Passamaquoddy Tribe of Indians for the completion of a new church at Pleasant Point, in the town of Perry.

Resolved, That the sum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) be and hereby is appropriated for the purpose of completing the new church at Pleasant Point in the town of Perry. Said money to be paid from the fund, belonging to the Passamaquoddy tribe of Indians, now in the State treasury. Said fund being the money received by the State for stumpage and for land sold belonging to said tribe, and that said sum be expended under the direction of the governor and council.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

This appropriation is asked for the purpose of completing the new church at Pleasant Point for which an appropriation of \$3,500 was made two years ago. This amount has been expended under the direction of the governor and council, and has been found insufficient to finish and complete the church in a satisfactory manner, and it is necessary to have this additional amount of one thousand dollars, (\$1,000) from the Indian fund to paint, heat, light and furnish seats, etc., for same.
