STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THREE.

AN ACT to amend section 1 of chapter 185 of the Public Laws of 1901, relating to truants.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section I. Section I of chapter 185 of the Public Laws of 2 nineteen hundred and one is hereby amended by striking out 3 the words in the first and second lines, "ages of seven and 4 fourteen inclusive," and inserting in their place 'seventh and 5 fifteenth anniversaries of his birth,' so that said section as 6 amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. I. Every child between the seventh and fifteenth 8 anniversaries of his birth shall attend some public day school 9 during the time such school is in session; provided that neces-

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10 sary absence may be excused by the superintending school 11 committee or superintendent of schools or teachers acting by 12 direction of either; provided also, that such attendance shall 13 not be required if the child obtained equivalent instruction, 14 for a like period of time, in an approved private school or in 15 any other manner approved by the superintending school 16 committee; provided, further, that children shall not be 17 credited with attendance at a private school until a certificate 18 showing their names, residence and attendance at such school 19 signed by the person or persons having such school in charge, 20 shall be filed with the school officials of the town in which said 21 children reside; and provided, further, that the superintending 22 school committee may exclude from the public schools any 23 child whose physical or mental condition makes it inexpedient 24 for him to attend.'

All persons having children under their control shall cause 26 them to attend school as provided in this section, and for 27 every neglect of such duty shall forfeit a sum not exceeding 28 twenty-five dollars, to the treasurer of the city or town or 29 shall be imprisoned not exceeding thirty days.
