IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THREE.

AN ACT to amend section three of chapter one hundred and three of the Public Laws of 1895, relating to telegraph and telephone companies.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Section 1. Section three of chapter one hundred and three
2 of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-five is
3 hereby amended by striking out the following words after the
4 "incorporation" in the fifth line thereof, viz: "But no corpo-
5 ration organized hereunder shall have authority without
6 special act of the legislature, to construct its lines along the
7 route or routes, used or authorized to be used, by any other
8 telegraph or telephone company, person or firm, or between
9 points connected, or authorized to be connected, by the lines

10 of any such company, person or firm, unless it shall first
11 obtain the consent of such other company, person or firm,”
12 so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

‘Sect. 3. Corporations organized under the provisions of
14 this act shall have authority, except as herein limited, to con-
15 struct, maintain and operate lines upon and along the route
16 or routes and between the points stated in its certificate of
17 incorporation.’
