STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the town of Moscow.

Resolved, That the sum of five hundred dollars for the year
2 nineteen hundred and three and five hundred dollars for the
3 year nineteen hundred and four be and hereby is appropri-
4 ated for the use and aid of the town of Moscow to partly
5 reimburse said town for money expended and to be expended
6 in making extraordinary repairs on the highways and
7 bridges in said town resulting from damages caused by the
8 freshet of December, 1901. The same to be paid on certificate
9 of the county commissioners of Somerset county that at least
10 an equal amount has been expended by said town for said
11 purpose.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The town of Moscow had in February, 1902, 117 polls taxed. Real and personal estate valued at \$100,090. Rate of taxation, three cents and nine mills.

Moscow has about forty miles of road, one road of about five miles which is used in summer for hauling lumber with heavy teams; also one of eight miles used in winter and spring for the same purpose. There are several long hills on which bridle chains are used.

Expended on highways and bridges in 1901,	\$1,520 10
Expended on highways and bridges in 1902,	1,700 00
Expended for new iron bridge in 1902. . . .	2,115 00
It will take to make the roads as good as they were before the freshet.	600 00
Interest bearing orders against the town. .	5,048 46
Interest due on orders.	246 00

These are the facts as near as we can give them.
