STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THREE.

AN ACT to authorize the Kennebec Log Driving Company to maintain piers and booms in the Kennebec river above the Augusta dam.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Section 1. The Kennebec Log Driving Company is hereby
2 authorized and empowered to locate and maintain in the
3 Kennebec river between the Augusta dam and Five Mile
4 Island boom, so called, piers and booms for the purpose of
5 holding, sorting and rafting logs and other lumber coming
6 down said river.

Sect. 2. Said piers and booms shall be so constructed as
2 not to impede the use or navigation of said river.

Sect. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
