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## STATE OF MAINE.

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND THREE.

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AN ACT amendatory to chapter three hundred and sixty-nine of the Private and Special Laws of 1889, entitled "An Act regulating the appointment of the members of the police force of the city of Bangor.

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*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Chapter three hundred and sixty-nine of the Private and  
2 Special Laws of 1889 is hereby amended by adding thereto  
3 the following sections:

'Sect. 10. Any officer of the police force who shall receive  
5 any injuries while in the discharge of his duties whereby  
6 death results within six months from the time of receiving  
7 said injuries, leaving a widow or minor children under the

8 age of sixteen years, such widow shall be placed upon a pen-  
9 sion roll of said city, from the date of said officer's death, at  
10 the rate of twelve dollars per month during her widowhood,  
11 and shall also be paid two dollars per month for each child  
12 of such officer under sixteen years of age ; and in case of death  
13 or remarriage of such widow leaving a child or children of  
14 such officer under the age of sixteen years, such pension shall  
15 be paid to such child or children until the age of sixteen.

'Sect. 11. The city is hereby authorized to place upon said  
17 list the widow of Patrick Henry Jordan and her children,  
18 who was shot while in the discharge of his duties in accord-  
19 ance with the above section ten.

'Sect. 12. The city treasurer is hereby authorized to pay  
21 said pension monthly upon proof of death of such officer.

'Sect 13. This act shall take effect when approved.'
