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## STATE OF MAINE.

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND THREE.

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AN ACT to regulate fishing in Kennebago lake and other lakes  
and ponds and their tributaries, in Franklin county.

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*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in  
Legislature assembled, as follows :*

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to fish for, in any way, or  
2 catch any fish of any kind, in Kennebago lake, John's pond,  
3 Flat-Iron pond, Blanchard pond and in all the streams flowing  
4 into the same, situated in the county of Franklin, except in  
5 the ordinary method of casting with artificial flies or fly fish-  
6 ing ; it shall also be unlawful to fish for, catch or kill, in any  
7 one day, more than ten fish in any of the following named  
8 waters : Kennebago lake, Little Kennebago lake, John's pond,  
9 Flat-Iron pond, Blanchard pond, the Seven ponds, so called,

10 and in any of the streams flowing into any of the above named  
11 lakes or ponds ; also, in the stream flowing out of Little Ken-  
12 nebago lake to the dam at the head of Kennebago falls, and  
13 in the stream flowing out of Kennebago lake, commencing  
14 four rods above the Berlin Mills Company's bridge, and con-  
15 tinuing down said stream to its junction with the stream  
16 flowing from Little Kennebago lake.

So much of section 5 of chapter 42 of the Public Laws of  
18 1899 as is inconsistent with this act is hereby repealed.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this act  
2 shall be subject to a penalty of not less than ten dollars nor  
3 more than thirty dollars and costs for each offense.
