STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THREE.

AN ACT regulating fishing in Quimby pond in the county of Franklin.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to take,
- 2 catch, kill or have in possession more than six fish in all in
- 3 Quimby pond, so called, in Rangeley, in the county of Frank-
- 4 lin, in any one day, and so much of section five of chapter
- 5 forty-two of the Public Laws as is inconsistent with this act
- 6 is hereby repealed.
- Sect. 2. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this act
- 2 shall be subject to a penalty of not less than ten dollars nor
- 3 more than thirty dollars and costs for each offense.
