STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THREE.

AN ACT to repeal so much of section five of chapter forty-two of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-nine, as prohibits fishing in the inlet stream of Squaw Pan lake from Thibadeau's landing to the source of said stream.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. So much of section five, so called, of chapter 2 forty-two of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-3 nine, as prohibits the taking, catching or killing of any fish 4 in the inlet stream or streams of Squaw Pan lake, in the

5 county of Aroostook, from Thibadeau's landing to the source
6 of said stream or streams, said stream or streams being in
7 township eleven, range four, is hereby repealed.

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
