STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THREE.

AN ACT to amend section six of chapter eleven of the Revised Statutes of Maine relating to the raising and expending of Common School Funds.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section six of chapter eleven of the Revised 2 Statutes is hereby amended by inserting before the word 3 "schools" in the second line of said section the word 'common' 4 and by adding after the word "deficiency" in the eighth and 5 last line in said section the words 'and all moneys provided 6 by towns, or apportioned by the State for the support of com-7 mon schools shall be expended for the maintenance of com-8 mon schools established and controlled by the town by which 9 said moneys are provided or to which said moneys are appor10 tioned.' So that said section as amended by this act shall 11 read as follows, viz:

'Every town shall raise and expend, annually, for the sup-13 port of common schools therein, exclusive of the income of 14 any corporate school fund or of any grant from the revenue 15 or funds from the State, or of any voluntary donation, devise 16 or bequest, or of any forfeiture accruing to the use of schools, 17 not less than eighty cents for each inhabitant, according to 18 the census by which representatives to the legislature were 19 last apportioned, under penalty of forfeiting not less than 20 twice no r more than four times the amount of the deficiency, 21 and all moneys provided by towns, or apportioned by the 22 State for the support of common schools shall be expended 23 for the maintenance of common schools established and con-24 trolled by the town by which said moneys are provided, or 25 to which said moneys are apportioned.'

Sect. 2. All acts or parts of acts inconsistent with this act 2 are hereby repealed.

Sect. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
