STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THREE.

AN ACT to make certain the meaning of the language "Timber and Grass," relating to the Public Lots so called in unincorporated townships in State of Maine.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. The language "timber and grass," as relates to
2 the public lots, so called, in unincorporated townships in State
3 of Maine is hereby construed to mean all growth of every
4 description on said lots.

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
